The Town of Morrisville conducted an intermediate outreach phase to get citizen input about the 2021 Bond Referendum from April 19 through May 14, 2021, as the Town works toward the next phase of formally adopting the bond categories that will appear on the ballot in November.

In addition to a robust social media campaign, the input portal was reopened, two open houses were held, a video was produced, and signage was placed throughout Morrisville. Town staff also attended the Farmers' Market to educate and inform residents.

In November 2021 Morrisville voters will decide if Town officials are authorized to issue general obligation bonds totaling up to \$37 million to finance several capital projects that will impact the future of the growing Morrisville community for years to come.


Morrisville Smart Shuttle Coming Soon

Morrisville's Smart Shuttle, the Town's newest public transit service, will soon be launching! What makes Morrisville's Smart Shuttle so smart? Riders will utilize the Smart Shuttle app on their smartphone to request a pick-up or drop-off from one of 14 nodes, or stops, located around the town. Riders will be able to track the bus through the mobile technology.

From Fitness to Endurance, 'Morrisville Strong'

The Town's Public Works staff maintains numerous amenities in our parks and greenways that are great for visitors looking for an outdoor workout opportunity.

For runners looking for a 5K course, there are two greenways that fit the bill. A round trip run from the Indian Creek Trailhead to the end of the Indian Creek Greenway is 3.1 miles. For individuals looking for a more challenging 5K run, Shiloh Greenway starting at Church Street Park, has numerous hills and turns on the path. A round trip from the Church Street Park to the I-540 bridge is 3.1 miles.

The Public Works Community Enhancement Division maintains all of Morrisville's greenways, with staff cleaning the trail, emptying the garbage and recycling cans, and restocking the dog stations several times each week.

For those looking to get a strength workout, there are several outdoor adult workout stations at Morrisville's parks, maintained by Public Works staff.

The newly constructed shaded 1,500 square-foot adult workout circuit area at Morrisville Community Park offers visitors 10 different strength training stations. Church Street Park and North West Park also have outdoor workout station circuit areas that offer visitors a chance to have a great workout.

The North West Park workout station circuits are situated along a walking trail loop and offers the opportunity to get a cardio workout while running from station to station.


The Public Works staff maintains all Morrisville workout stations using the same safety and sanitation procedures used on the park playgrounds. This includes regular inspections by a certified playground safety inspector who checks for damage or areas that might cause visitor injury. All of Morrisville's playgrounds and workout circuits are pressure washed and sanitized on a quarterly basis.

On February 23, Town Council unanimously adopted the new Morrisville Land Use Plan, following three years of work by staff, Morrisville citizens, Planning and Zoning Board members, Town Council members, and the consultant for the project, Houseal Lavigne.

The new Morrisville Land Use Plan will guide future development in Morrisville, and includes detailed subarea plans for the Town Center area, the Transit Oriented Development (TOD) areas around NC 54, McCrimmon Parkway and Watkins Road (across from the Wake Tech campus), and the McCrimmon Parkway Extension area.

Connect Morrisville Strategic Plan Updates

Over the last several months, staff has been working hard on revising the Connect Morrisville Strategic Plan. Staff members were authorized to proceed with the revision process at the October 26, 2020 Town Council work session.

At the February Town Council Retreat staff outlined preliminary recommendations and the engagement process. The first three weeks of March provided both the Morrisville community and Town staff an opportunity to provide feedback through social media, surveys, and direct engagement efforts. Feedback received from this process provided revisions that were proposed to Council in April. All feedback will be incorporated and compiled to form final revisions, scheduled to go before Town Council in June.

Summer Home Improvement - Sheds

What do you need to know if you are considering putting a shed in your backyard? There are two things you will need to identify. First, determine what size shed you plan on installing. A building permit is required if any shed dimension exceeds 12 feet in length, width, or height. Second, determine where on your property you are placing the shed and know the existing lot coverage of your property. The lot coverage is considered land covered by buildings and hard surfaces.

The Town of Morrisville has planning requirements that can impact shed locations and maximum lot coverage. After you have determined the size and location, contact the Planning Department by calling (919) 463-6210 for plot plan submittal requirements. If a building permit is required based on your dimensions, contact the Inspections Department at (919) 463-6190.

The Town of Morrisville has developed a Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Operating Budget and Capital Investment Program (CIP) recommendation.

The recommendation outlines the Town's plan to "Relaunch Morrisville." The budget outlines how your tax dollars will be put to work for our growing community to meet core services, provide program and service improvements, and plan for long-term needs.

The budget and capital plan were guided by collective stakeholder voices and strategic goals that work through key projects and initiatives designed to meet the growing and emerging interest of the community. The Highlights and the Budget/CIP Priorities shown to the left demonstrate how the FY 2022 Budget/CIP plans to use your tax dollars to make great things happen in Morrisville.

This transformative budget Relaunches Morrisville in fulfilling existing commitments, essential investments and works to keep pace with the dynamic growing service needs while responsibly safeguarding the Town's financial condition. The FY 2022 Budget is balanced utilizing available revenue capacity, leveraging other reserves, and aided by the inclusion of anticipated American Rescue Plan Act funds without a proposed tax increase this year.

Morrisville Senior Center Opens at McCrimmon Corners!

The new Morrisville Senior Center opened in March of 2021 in the McCrimmon Corners Shopping Center, between Cat Care Veterinary Clinic and Saffron Indian Cuisine & Lounge.

The center provides participants a variety of classes and programs including low impact cardio interval aerobics, line dancing, Tai Chi, yoga, bingo, and trivia. Computer training and information sessions with Morrisville's fire and police departments are also available. Social activities and field trips starting at the center include visits to local parks and other off-site locations.

For all onsite classes and programs, the new facility boasts a large, naturally lit multi-purpose room, a classroom, and new technologies for programming. For years Morrisville's senior citizens programs were operated out of Cedar Fork Community Center, which also offers pre-school, youth, adult recreation, and athletics programs.

In 2019, Town Council decided a new facility was needed with dedicated space and staff to provide programs and activities for local seniors.

In 2020, the Town worked to find a new location and space and in 2021 renovations started at 4117 Davis Drive in the McCrimmon Corners Shopping Center, completing in March.

Due to the Coronavirus pandemic, programming activities are limited to ensure adequate spacing and social distancing among participants. All participants are required to wear masks while in the facility. Programming availability and capacity will expand as the pandemic restrictions ease.
