Morrisville Smart Shuttle

Connects Morrisville

The Morrisville Smart Shuttle, the Town's newest public transit service, will be launching on Saturday, October 2!

What makes Morrisville's Smart Shuttle so smart? Riders will utilize the Smart Shuttle application on their smartphone to request a pick-up or drop-off from one of 15 nodes, or stops, located around the Town. Riders will be able to track the bus through the mobile application.

This free shuttle service connecting Morrisville will be operated by GoCary, the public transportation provider in Cary, and use the Via Transportation platform for requesting rides.

Fall 2021 Morrisville Election Day Information

Four seats on Morrisville's Town Council will reach their term expiration in December 2021, and therefore, those seats will be eligible to be filled, either by the current Council Member if applicable, or by an opposing candidate. Elections are impartially conducted by the Wake County Board of Elections (Wake BOE) and Durham County Board of Elections for those Morrisville residents residing within Durham County. Candidates for election are listed in the right column in alphabetical order by district with (I) signifying an incumbent.

When to Vote

Election Day is Tuesday, November 2, from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. that evening. Check your voter registration card or the Wake BOE website for your specific polling location, early voting, or absentee by mail voting information.

On the Ballot

Remember that Morrisville voters have the authority to vote for and elect every member of the Council, not only their district representative. When you vote, you will select four candidates, one for each of the four seats available. Morrisville voters will also be presented three bond referendum ballot questions. The categories include Public Safety; Streets, Sidewalks, and Connectivity; and Parks, Recreation, and Amenities.






Make a splash at the Morrisville Aquatics and Fitness Center this fall!

Three Ballot Questions Set for November 2

November 2, Morrisville voters will decide Help Shape Morrisville's Future Together if Town officials will be authorized to issue • general obligation bonds totaling up to \$37 million to finance important capital projects that will impact the future of the growing Morrisville community for years to come. The three questions on the ballot focus on leveraging an additional three cents in the tax rate to invest in public safety; future parks, recreation, and amenities; and streets, sidewalks, and connectivity improvements.

Morrisville Receives 2021 All-America City Award

On June 9, 2021, the Town of Morrisville was recognized as one of 10 All-America City award winners for 2021. The National Civic League presented this honor to recognize Morrisville's work in inclusive civic engagement to build equity and resilience and create stronger connections among residents, businesses, and nonprofit and government leaders.

Town staff submitted its community-wide work on building equity and resilience and three projects for consideration, and was selected as one of 20 finalists. On July 7-9, finalist communities made presentations virtually to a jury of eleven national thought-leaders, showing how their community leverages civic engagement, collaboration, inclusiveness, and innovation to successfully address local issues.

"We are happy to designate Morrisville as an All-America City. They showed us through their application and presentation that they do a great job of engaging the entire community to build equity and resilience," said National Civic League President Doug Linkhart.

Morrisville brought staff and community partners together to win this prestigious honor for the Town. Many thanks are in order for Wake County Health and Human Services, Western Wake Farmers' Market, Morrisville Community Garden, Triangle Cricket League, Morrisville Cardinals cricket team, and the Morrisville Chamber of Commerce.



Airport Boulevard Extension Phase I Project

The NC Department of Transportation (NCDOT) continues work on the Airport Boulevard Extension Phase I project, with anticipated funding by the Town, G.O. Bonds, and federal transportation funds. The project will extend Airport Boulevard from Garden Square Lane, west of Town Hall Drive, to Church Street.

The NCDOT is currently continuing preliminary engineering on the project. Right-of-way acquisition is expected to begin between late 2021 and early 2022. Construction on the project is expected to begin in late 2022, early 2023. A public meeting was held for the project in April 2021, and NCDOT has posted a meeting summary and response to comments received at the meeting on the project website, available by visiting the link below.

The Town staff is continuing to work with NCDOT to address resident questions from the public meeting. Updates about the project will be available on the Town's website and through other communications.

Updated Connect Morrisville Strategic Plan

At its July 13, 2021 meeting, Town Council unanimously approved the updated Connect Morrisville Strategic Plan for 2021-2024. Over the previous nine months (and a total of six and a half meeting hours with Town Council and department heads), the Morrisville community, staff, and elected officials collaborated to develop this thorough and comprehensive plan update. It was important to take time to review and discuss each element, to deliver an updated plan reflective of current community and organizational needs, as well as future aspirations.

Our mission, vision, four core values, and six goals remain the same. We were able to streamline and organize the plan to 17 objectives, 17 initiatives, and 20 outcome measures – a reduction of nearly half these elements from our original plan in 2018. Staff developed a comprehensive plan document, featuring a narrative of our plan development and update processes, a reference section providing further detail to the corresponding noted element, and a glossary of terms featured within the plan and frequently used in government to better inform our readers. A color scheme and graphic were assigned to each goal and can be referenced throughout. A one-page version of the plan was also designed to further showcase the linear alignment (objectives > initiatives > outcome measures) and provides all pertinent plan information in one location. For our Neighborhood Spotlight, we catch up with the HOA president and HOA vice president of the Kitts Creek community to talk about their community activity.

Share a few programs the community has been a part of in collaboration with the Town of Morrisville.

We always join the National Night Out event in collaboration with the Morrisville Police Department and work to add something to it to attract neighbors. In 2019 (pre-pandemic) we had ice cream to hand out on a hot evening to encourage participation and made sure to highlight our support of our police. For Earth Day, we have done the trash clean-up using tools the Town has supplied. Our community has worked with the Morrisville Police Department and public safety to address parking and speeding concerns. We have also held resident information sessions (pre-pandemic) with Morrisville Fire and Police departments to learn about safety and security best practices for our neighborhood.

What are a few things that the Kitts Creek Community is currently engaged in and excited about?

We are working on keeping our community as close and safe as possible during the pandemic by being creative about new outside events. In September, October, and November, we are piloting a Kitts Creek Farmer's Market where neighbors can showcase their businesses and makers can sell items. With the pool season ending, we will be adding a permanent corn hole game and hopefully an outdoor ping pong table to our historic green for community fun. We started our first Kitts Creek Food Truck Rodeo and it was so successful the vendors ran out! Halloween is epic in Kitts Creek! Every year the decorations have leveled up and we cannot wait to see what our neighborhood does this year! The HOA holds an event for the kids that includes a parade around our central complex and it seems that everyone is out and mingling on Halloween evening!

Smart City Dashboard

As the Town moves forward with the Smart Morrisville initiatives, the Smart City Dashboard (http://smartmorrisville.townofmorrisville.org) has been launched!

The dashboard is focused on providing citizens with updated information about Town amenities, utilizing different types of sensors, and automating several Town processes. The dashboard currently has the field status at Cedar Fork District Park and the status of the Morrisville Aquatics & Fitness Center (MAFC) tennis courts.

The Smart City Dashboard will act as the information hub for all Smart Morrisville projects as they are added.

Sensors installed on the courts at MAFC determine if a court is occupied and sends that information to the Smart City Dashboard so you can see if they are in use before you leave the house.

At Cedar Fork District Park, moisture and flood sensors around the creek and fields relay information to the dashboard throughout the day to give staff a real-time update on field conditions. The dashboard provides field users the status of the fields. They can also sign up to be notified when a field's status changes.

The East Meets West Festival celebrates Morrisville, Wake County's most diverse community, with food, culture, and music from around the world. This year's festival will feature an immersive art gallery, a virtual passport to visit Morrisville shops & restaurants, and small events throughout the week highlighting festival favorites. Development Projects in Town

Town-Wide Sidewalk Construction

The Town is working on the implementation phase of the Town's sidewalk improvement program which includes providing sidewalk connectivity at locations where sidewalks do not currently exist. At the Council's direction, a priority list has been developed and projects are in various stages of development including planning, design, and construction phases. Currently, Copley Parkway, Paramount Parkway, and Cary Parkway locations are under construction and will continue through the fall of 2021. Other locations that are in the design phase include Airport Boulevard, Morrisville Community Park, NC-54, and the Louis Stephens Drive locations. Some of the proposed sidewalk projects will be included with the Streets, Sidewalks, and Connectivity Improvements category of the upcoming 2021 Morrisville Bond Referendum.

Green and Fairview Stormwater Improvement Projects

The Town is currently managing the construction of two major stormwater improvement projects at Green Drive and Fairview Avenue that involves culvert replacements to alleviate localized flooding during larger storm events. The project started in June of 2021 and involves drainage pipe replacement, water, and sanitary sewer line relocations as well as paving and stream restoration. The project is under construction and is anticipated to be completed in the fall of 2021. The project is being funded using stormwater utility fees collected for the maintenance and upkeep of Morrisville's stormwater system as required by the state. Once complete, the project will provide for increased stormwater capacity in the area.

Recycling Participation and Contamination Reduction Program

This fall the Town of Morrisville's Sustainability Program will embark on a new campaign, Recycling Participation and Contamination Reduction Program (RPCR), to increase our residential curbside recycling participation, while simultaneously reducing our overall contamination rates.

Recycling Participation

Our current curbside recycling rates have increased over the last two years from 55 percent in 2019 to 64 percent in 2020. Our goal is to increase the rate of participation for each route to 70 percent. According to the Recycling Partnership, the national average reported participation rate was 72 percent in 2019. The Town was awarded grant funding through the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality's (NCDEQ) Community Waste Reduction and Recycling program, to provide residents a refrigerator magnet with information on proper recycling tips. Help us get recycling participation to our goal of 70 percent by ensuring you're recycling right!

Contamination Reduction

To help reduce recycling contamination, please keep those plastic retail bags out of your recycle bin as they are a major cause of equipment malfunctions at the sorting facilities. To recycle these bags, bring them to a retail store directly.

This overall effort will be accompanied by a social media and marketing campaign facilitated by a youth group called Dedicated to Our Community of North Carolina (DOCNC), a student-led non-profit supporting community organizations through fundraising and volunteer support. The group has chosen to support the Town's Sustainability Program for the 2021 Fiscal Year.
