What makes Providence Place Special?

We celebrated Easter and combined the holiday with a Holi celebration. We have also started a teen night which creates an opportunity for engagement for our community's teenagers.

Everybody in our community for the most part knows each other. Our families know each other and we have a great close-knit feeling for our neighbors. We take pride in looking out for each other. We are a diverse community with many different cultures represented. We embrace this and use our events to learn and teach each other about our roots. It's fabulous to be able to lean on one another and share our talents with the community. I've never seen a group rally to help someone in a bind like my neighbors! When someone is in need our community definitely takes care of one another. In July 2021, a resident lost their home to a fire. Our community rallied together to collect items to help the family. At our August dive-in pool movie night, we sold BBQ and ice cream and raised over \$750 that we gave to the family. We always have each other's backs. If I forget to put my garage door down, I know I'll get a text from my neighbor by 9 p.m. asking me if I know

it's still up. If someone sees something concerning or suspicious, they're going to post on our community Facebook page to alert others.

Why is engagement with the Town of Morrisville important to the Providence Place community?

Community engagement with the Town is important to us because community collaborations allow us the opportunity to keep our community members informed and engaged. We enjoyed having first responders come out to our events and engage with our community members.

If you are a Morrisville resident and served by GFL Waste Management trash and recycling, you should have received a 'Recycle More' magnet in the mail. The Town of Morrisville needs your help to increase our residential curbside recycling participation and reduce overall recycling contamination. We currently have 55 percent participation, which is above the industry average, but we're shooting for 70 percent across all five of our Morrisville routes.

The Town of Morrisville was awarded grant funding through the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality's Community Waste Reduction and Recycling program, designed to help provide residents information on proper recycling tips.

Cleantech Impact Award

Morrisville Receives Cleantech Impact Award

On December 8, 2021, the Town of Morrisville proudly received the 2021 Cleantech Impact: Local Government Award at the 2021 Cleantech Innovation Awards for work done on the Connected Park Initiative at Cedar Fork District Park.

A Smart City Project, the Connected Park Initiative included installing occupancy sensors at Town parks to let the community know if they are available for use, enhancing the use of green spaces and helping residents avoid unnecessary trips to courts and fields when they are occupied.

The project also included installing autonomous flood and ground moisture sensors in partnership with Green Stream, an environmental technology firm, so that the parks management team can be alerted to flooding, which has historically been an issue for Morrisville.

The Research Triangle Cleantech Cluster (RTCC) 2021 Cleantech Innovation Awards recognize the people, organizations, and initiatives driving cleantech innovation, creative deployment solutions, and workforce development in our region and throughout North Carolina.
